



Pursuant to a warrant from Edward Pennington then surveyor General bearing date ye 9th day of ye 10th mo. 1701 directed unto me I do certify that there was surveyed 23d of ye 10th mo. next ensuing unto John Morris a certain tract of land in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a corner stake deviding it from Jobe Bates land being in the line deviding the County of Philadelphia from the County of Bucks from thence by the said line of of marked trees ~~and ye same~~ north west 500 — to a stake deviding it from other land of ye said John Morris from thence by a line of marked trees and ye same land south west 160 perches to another stake deviding it ^{from} other land belonging to ditto from thence by a line of marked trees and ye same land south east 500 perches to another stake in ye line of Jobe Bates land from thence by a line of marked trees and ye same land north east 160 perches to ye place of beginning containing and laid out for 500 acres of land and is according to bounds above described returned into ye General Surveyors office at Philadelphia ye 22d of ye 7th mo. 1702
