



Pursuant to a warrant from Edward Penington then Surveyor Generall bearing date the 9th day of ye 10th mo. 1701. directed unto me I do certify that I have surveyed unto John Morris the 23d day of ye same mo. a certaine tract of land in ye county of Philadelphia beginning at a stake in the line of Jobe Bates land being a corner deviding it from other lands of ye said John Morris ~~from~~ from thence by a line of ~~marked~~ trees and ye same land north west 500 perches to ~~a stake set in the~~ other lands of ye said Morris from thence by a line of ~~marked~~ trees and ye same land south west 160 perches thence by a line of ~~marked~~ trees south east 500 perches by dittos land to a line of ye said Bates land thence by the said line of marked trees and ye same land north east 160 perches to ye place of beginning containing and laid out for 500 acres of land and is according to ye bounds above described returned into ye Generall Surveyors offic at Philadelphia ye 22d of ye 7th mo. 1702
