



Pursuant unto 2 warrs from Edward Penington the then Survey^r: Generall directed unto me beareing date the 9th of ye 10th mo. 1701. I hearby certiefy that I have surveyd the 23^d of ye same unto John Morris a certain tract of land in ye County of Philladelphia beginneing at a post set in the ground being a corner deviding it from other land of ye said John Morris from thenc by a line of marked trees north west 333 perches & 1/3 part to a whit oak marked deviding it from vaccant land from thenc by a line of marked trees and same land north east 480 perches to a stake set in the ground in the line deviding the County of Philladelphia & the county of Bucks from thenc by the said line of marked trees south east 333 perches & 1/3 to a stake set in the ground being a corner deviding it from the afo^rs^d other lands of ye said John Morris from thenc by a line of marked trees and ye same land south west 480 perches to ye first plac^e of beginneing containeng one thousand acres of land and is according to ye bounds above described returnd into ye Generall survey^rs offic^e at Philladelphia the 7th day of ye 7th mo. 1702
