 Shippen ^{the younger} late of Philadelphia Deceased That we would Grant her to
 take up the quantity of four hundred & Eighty Six Acres and two third
 parts of an Acre of Land in this Province in part of the Original pur-
 chase of Two Thousand Acres made of the late Proprietor by Charles
 Jones Sen^r & Charles Jones jun^r of the City of Bristol and Given to
 the Said Margaret by the Last Will & Testament of her Grand Mother
 Esther Shippen late of the said City Decd who together with her Husband
 Edward Shippen the Elder by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 3^d
 & 4th dayes of November Anno-1711 - purchased the whole of the said
 Charles Jones Sen^r who Survived the said Charles Jones jun^r

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be
 Survey'd unto the said Margaret Shippen according to the Method
 of Townships in the said Province the said quantity of four hundred
 & Eighty Six Acres & two third parts of an Acre of Land which hath
 not been already Surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the
 Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order
 for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands & the lesser Seal
 of the Province at Philadelphia the 20th day of ye third Month Anno Dni
 1725
