At the Request of Abel Strettell of the City of Dublin in the Kingdom of Ireland by his Attorney Thomas Hatton that We would Grant him to take up the Quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land further in part of the Original Purchase of five Thousand Acres made of the late Proprietary by George Shore of Athlone in the Said Kingdom The Right whereof being now Vested in the said Abel Strettell. These are to Authorise and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto ye said Abell Strettell in Right of the aforesaid Purchase According to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 4<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> Month Anno Dni 1729.
