Report. The above tract appears to have been survey'd 25 February 1791, in connection with the dotted figure marked C on an Order of Survey to John Rannels dated — as per a draft in office, — find that afterwards to wit, on the 11 Oct: 1807, the dotted figure C was survey'd In pursuance of an Order of the Board of Property and on an order of Survey'd to John Rannels dated 16 Jan: 1767, No. 2456 and confirmed by Patent. The above Tract A. & B. is said to be patented on Rannels right; but no evidence of the same is produced. The above ~~set~~ tract was recognized at an early day as the claim of Henry Heil.
