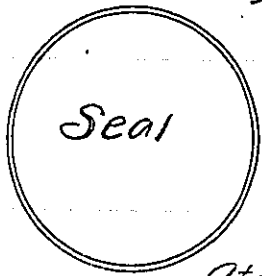

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup> in Chief  
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of John Powel That I would grant him a Resurvey  
on a Tract of Land Situate on the River Skuykill between the Lands  
of William Smith & Barnabas Wilcox laid out to his ffather William  
Powel on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of the fifth Month 1684 for two hundred and  
fifty Acres, These are to Require thee forthwith to Resurvey or Cause  
to be resurveyd unto him the Said Tracts according to the true Lines  
of the forementioned Survey, And make Returns thereof into my  
Secretaries Office, Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia  
the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> Month 1700
