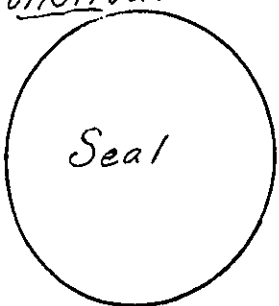

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup>

in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of Joseph Kirtle That I would grant him a Resurvey on a Tract of land in Ben-Salem Township in the County of Bucks reputed to contain four hundred Acres being part of 600 Acres formerly laid out by my Warr<sup>t</sup> to Nathaniel Allen and by his Heirs and Executors Sold to the S<sup>d</sup> Jos Kirtl,

These are to require thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be resurveyd the Said Tract of 400 Acres according to its first Boundaries and Lines of Survey. And make exact Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 17<sup>th</sup> day of ye 11<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1700.
