

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hands of the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of property and the Seal of the province bearing date the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1702 Granting unto J<sup>no</sup> Eastburn of Southampton a Resurvey on three hundred acres of Land in his possession being part of five hund<sup>d</sup> acres granted to Robert Marsh Scituate in the said Township There is Resurvey'd unto John Eastborn a Tract of land in Southampton Township in the County of Bucks beginning at a Post by the Street at Widow Cutlers Corner from thence by the Said Street North West two hundred sixty two perches to a post then North east by J<sup>no</sup> Nailors overplus land three hundred twenty two perches to a post from thence South east by the Said Nailors land One hundred perches to a third post then by the said Nailors old Tract south forty three degrees & three quarters Westerly two hundred twenty two perches to a fourth post from thence by the same land South east one hundred fifty seven perches to a fifth post from thence by the Widow Cutlers land South west one hundred perches to the place of beginning. Containing three hundred and five acres and three quarters Resurveyed by J<sup>no</sup> Cutler the 6<sup>th</sup> of 6<sup>th</sup> month 1702.
