



By virtue of A Warrant from the Commissioners of Property to me directed bearing date the 10th day of the first Month 170^{1/2} to execute all Warr^{ts} directed to Phineas Pemberton and not executed And pursuant to a Warrant from Edward Pennington Survey^r Gen^l to the said Phineas Pemberton dated the 19th day of the first month 170², Resurveyed unto Jonathan Eldridge a Tract of Land in Newtown in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Small Hickery at Abraham Whorley's Corner, Thence by the Said Whorley's Town Lott W. by N. 146. perches to a White Oak, Then by the Common N. by E. 29 per: to a heap of Stones at Thomas Hilborn's Corner, Then by the Said Hilborn's Town Lotts E by S. 146. P: to a heap of Stones, Then N by E 91 1/2 per: to a Stone. Then W. by N. 41 P. to a black oak, Then by the Said Hilborn's Country Lott N. 13 deg^s E. 466 perches to a Post. Then by Vacant Land E. 21 deg^s S 123. per: to a Post by a great Hickery. Then by the Said Whorley's Country Lott S. 21 deg^s W 544 per: to a white oak two perches and an half from the Corner of the Town Lott Then S. by W. 26 1/2 per: to the place of beginning, Containing 289 Acres. Resurveyed the 29th day of the 7th month 1702.
