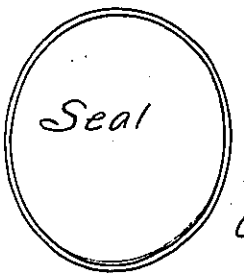

At the Request of David Powel That We would grant him a Resurvey on a certain Lott Scituate in Philadelphia in the Second Street on Delaware Side on the South Side of Rob<sup>t</sup> Lodges, laid out in right of Thomas Grosdales purchase of 500 Acres, These are to <sup>authorize &</sup> require thee forthwith to lay out to Thy Self with the Assistance and under the Inspection of Jacob Taylor a Lott in the 5<sup>d</sup> place of thirty five foot in breadth and of an equal length with the adjacent Lotts also for supplying the Deficiency in the 5<sup>d</sup> Lotts of the Usual breadth of the adjacent Lotts twenty foot in breadth of the nearest vacancy in the third Street and make Returns into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>la</sup> Where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee Certified by the Secretary.
