John Coales of Catcut in Sumersetshier made of the Proprietary
by Deeds of Lease & Release dated ye 9th & 10th dayes of September
Anno — 1681 Whose nearest kinsman and heir William Woodland of
Kent County in Maryland by like Deeds, ^{dated ye 22 & 23 days of 8^{br} last} conveyed ye same to the Said
Samuel Powel who also requests that the Liberty Land appurtenant to
the Same may be laid out to him Within the Liberties of the Said City.
These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Surveyed
unto the Said Samuel Powel in the Said City the said Lots of Ground where
they fell by Allotment or as near as may be to the same place, and
the Liberty Land within the Liberties thereof proportionably to the
said purchase on which side the River Schuylkill the Same may
fall or ~~be~~ be found Vacant and make Returns of the whole into
the Seretarys Office in Ord^r for a further Confirmation,
Given under our hands and the Seal of ye Province at Philad-
-elphia the 5th day of 9^{br} Anno Dni 1719.*
