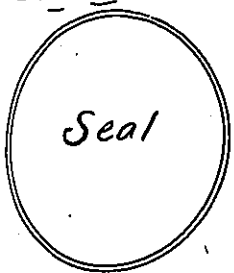

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of Samuel Baker Heir to Henry Baker deceased
That I would grant him a Resurvey on a Tract of Land in the
County of Bucks and Township of Makefield laid out to ye
s^d H Baker by virtue of my Warr^t for 300 Acres adjoining
on the Land of Ralph Milners Heirs and fronting ye River
Delaware. Also on a Tract of 250 Acres in ye s^d County and
Township formel^y laid out to Rich^d Hough but ~~was~~ by good
Deeds of Bargain and sale in the lawful possession of ye
s^d H Baker at the time of his Decease. These are to
require thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be Resurvey'd
~~Resurvey'd~~ the two said Tracts according to their just
Boundaries and first lines of Survey and make Return thereof
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at
Philadelphia the 11th day of ye 11th moth 1709
