County where not already taken up according to y<sup>e</sup> Method of  
Townships appointed by me & make returns thereof into my Secretarys  
Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 1683.
