



Resurveyed the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 1<sup>st</sup> month 170<sup>1/2</sup> by Virtue of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Governour to Edward Penington dated the 27<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> month 170<sup>1/2</sup> unto Tobias Dymoocke a Tract of land in Bensalem Township formerly laid out to Nathaniel Harding — Containing <sup>A: R: P:</sup> 302-2-36 Beginning at a Corner Post at Dunks's Corner, Thence by the Said Dunks's line from the River N 24<sup>degr</sup> W 404 per, to a Small Saplin, Then N 13 deg<sup>r</sup> W 69 perches, Then N.N.W 111 per to a Corner marked white Oake, Then W.S.W. 111 per to a Small White oake in Nehemiah Allen's line. — Then by the Same — N.N.W 96 per to a Corner marked White Oak, Then E.N.E by Joseph Growdon's great tract 160 perches to a Post, Then S.S.E 700 per: to a Post by the River Delaware, Then down the Same West 56 per. to the place of Beginning —
