At the Request of Tobias Dymocke That I would grant him a  
Resurvey on a certain Tract of Land on Delaware near Meshamine  
laid out for Two hundred and fifty Acres to Nathaniel Hardin first  
Purchaser, now in the possession of the S<sup>d</sup> Tobias by his Wife Sarah  
Widow of the S<sup>d</sup> Hardin. These are to require thee forthwith to  
Resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the S<sup>d</sup> Tract according to its first  
Bounds and Lines of Survey and make Returns thereof into my
