



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month Anno Domini 1715, To lay out unto Samuel Barker one thousand acres of Land; Surveyed & laid out unto the S<sup>d</sup> Samuel Barker a tract of Land in Plumstead township in Bucks County, Beginning at a Post at Joseph Paul's Corner from thence extending North West by Francis Plumstead's Line four hundred <sup>hundred</sup> Eighty four perches to a black oak Stump and a Small Hickory Standing by it. Then North East by vacant Land One hundred Sixty Six perches to a Hickory tree, Then by vacant Land South East four hundred Eighty four perches to a Small black oak. Then by the S<sup>d</sup> Joseph Pauls Line South West One hundred Sixty Six perches to the place of beginning, Containing five hundred acres, Laid out the 3<sup>d</sup> day of the 7<sup>th</sup> month Ano. Dom 1716: Certified under my hand the day afores<sup>d</sup>.
