



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Commissioners to me directed bearing date the first day of the twetyth month 1702 In pursuance of the Proprietaries Orders left under his hand, Surveyed and Laid out unto George Brown of ffalls township a Tract of Land in the township of Soulbury in Bucks County Beginning at a White oak at Ezra Croasdale's Corner, Thence by Thomas Carus line North West one hundred perches to a Post two perches S:E from a Maple in a Run, Then North East by vacant Land Three hundred and twenty perches to a Post by a Small Hickery, Then South East by Vacant One hundred perches to a Small White Oak. Then by Ezra Croasdale's Land South West three hundred and twenty perches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred acres, Surveyed the 29th day of the 4th month 1703.
