



By virtue of a Warrant from the Com^{rs} of Property bearing date the 30th day of September 1718, Surveyed and laid out unto William Blackfan a Tract of Land lying in the Mannor of Highlands in Bucks County Beginning at a White Oak at Jeofrey Burgess Corner from thence Extending West 128 perches to a Post, Then by Thomas Kirle's Land North West 172 perches to a Post, Then North East by the S^d Mannor Land 152 perches to a black oak Then by the Same South East 204 perches to a black oak in the S^d Burgess Line Then by the S^d Line South 84 perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred & twelve acres, Certified under my hand the 27th day of the 10th month 1718.
