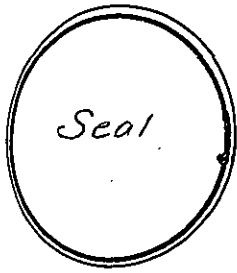


Pennsylvania S.S.

Whereas it has been made appear before us that Joseph Mather of the County of Philadelphia and William Smith of the County of Bucks Came Servants into this Province about the year 1682 and served their time to Phinehas Pemberton, and now Desire ~~z~~ they may have their head Land according to the Propriet<sup>r</sup>s Concessions and they Having Granted the same to Joseph English craves that <sup>it</sup> may be laid out to him, These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Surveyd unto the Said Joseph English in Right of <sup>ye said</sup> Joseph Mather and William Smith the ~~said~~ quantity of One Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and Make a Returne there of into the Secretarys office in Order to a further Confirmation.

Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadel-  
-phia the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the tenth Month Anno Din 1714
