

Pursuant to a warrant under the hand and Seal of the Proprietary and Governour bearing date the 17th of the 11^{mo} 1700 Granting unto Joseph Kirl a Resurvey on a Tract of land in Bensalem township in the County of Bucks, Reputed to Contain four hundred acres being part of 600 formerly laid out to Nehemiah Allen a by his heirs and Executors Sold to the Said Joseph Kirl.

There is Resurvey'd the Said Tract of land Beginning at a black Oak by Delaware River at the Corner of Joseph Growdon Land from thence by the Said land North 101¹/₂ north west Six hundred fifty eight perches to Post by Poetquessink Creek from thence east north east one hundred perches to a Small Hickory from thence South South east by Nehemiah Allen's Land Six hundred and thirty Seven perches to a Spanish Oak by the Said Delaware River from thence down the Same on the Several Courses thereof one hundred and five perches to the place of beginning, Containing two hundred and one Acres. Resurvey'd the 23^d of the first month 170¹/₂ by John Cutler
