



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries Comm^{rs} to me directed beareing date the 19th day of ye. 3^d month 1702 Surveyed and Laid out unto Ezra Croasdale (in right of the heires of William Bennet) a Tract of Land in Soulbury Township in the County of Bucks, Beginning at a Post at Samuel Beaks's Corner, Thence by Thomas Garus line N.W. 100. perches to a great White Oak, Then N.E. by Vacant Land 320. per: to a Small White Oake, Then by Vacant S.E. 100 perc: to a Post by a forked black Oak, Then by the Said Samuel Beaks's land S.W. 320. perches to the first mentioned Corner Post. Containing two hundred acres, Surveyed the 15th day of the 8th Month 1702
