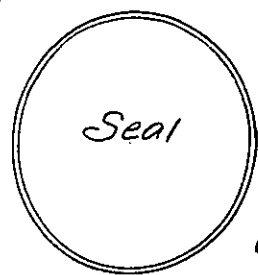

At the Request of Christopher Pennock Attorney for
Rich^d Pierce That I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres
of Land in right of his S^d Constituent old purchaser of one thousand
Acres. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be
Surveyd to him the Said Number of Acres of Land in this Province
not already taken up, nor Surveyd, nor Concealed; to be laid out
according to the method of Townships by me appointed, He taking
out a Patent for the Same for his said Constituent within
three Months after Returns shall be made thereof into my
Secretaries Office, ^{ch} W^{ch} thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient
Speed, Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{la} the 4th day
of 7^{ber} 1700.
