Surveyed for Mary more as the assignee of Thomas Brigs 250 acres of Land lying in the fork of Upland Creek beginning at a marked red oak standing by the s^d creek side and from thence runing up the s^d creek on several coarses to a marked post standing by the s^d creek and also in the line of the township of Concord and from thence along the s^d Concord line 66* pertch^{=NNW} to a marked oak being a marked corner tree of Thomas Brasey and from thence along the s^d braseys line of marked trees N. E. 6 E. 190 pertch. to a marked post being a corner mark of Gilbert Woellams land and from thence along the s^d Woellams line of marked trees S E 6 S. 210 pertch. to a marked post and from thence swbw 180 pertch. to the first menchened red oak.
