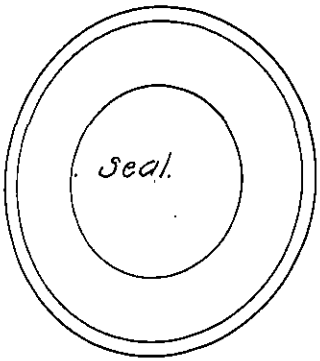


Pensylvania SS.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an agreement now made with John Moor of Concord in the County of Chester for three hundred and fifteen acres of Land (part of a Tract formerly granted to Robert Vernon of the Said County who afterwards Relinquished the said three hundred and fifteen acres) for which the said John Moor is to pay to the Propriet^{rs} use fifty Pounds Money of Pensylvania one half in hand & the other half in six Months after the date hereof and the yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres and so in proportion for the fifteen acres These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Moor in the Said County of Chester according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of Three hundred and fifteen acres of Land that hath not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said John fulfill the above agreement shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted
