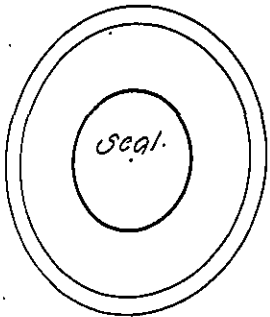

Upon an Agreement made with David Meredith for fifteen Hundred Acres of the vacant land left unsurvey'd within the Bounds of the Welch Tract These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out to the Said David the said quantity of fifteen Hundred Acres of Vacant ^{Land} Lying ^{above} ~~between~~ the uppermost Surveys made in the great Valley and in the same Range with the Said Lands by both their upper & Lower head Lines extended till they mett with the other Surveys adjoining on the Manor of Mountjoy and what shall be deficient thereof the quantity aforesaid make up out of the nearest Adjoyning that is vacant and accounted Barren. And make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 4th of ye 29th Moth 1706.
