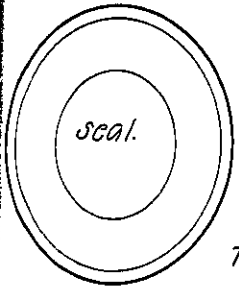


Pensilvania ss:

By the Commissioners of property



At the Request of James Michel late of the Kingdom of Ireland that we would grant him to take up near the River Sasquahannah the quantity of five hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary Trustees fifty pounds money of Pensilvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said James Michel at or near the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships, the said quantity of five hundred acres of Land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said James fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 16th day of 9th Anno Dni. 1719.
