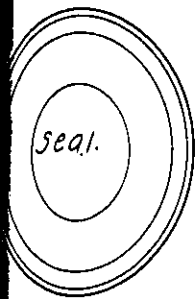

At the Request of Joseph Pennock by his father Christopher Pennock

that I would grant him to take up five hundred of Acres of Land in right
of Geo. Collet, old Purchaser, These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or
cause to be Survey'd unto him the Said Number of Acres of Land in this Pro-
vince not already taken up, Survey'd, nor concealed, to be laid out according
to the method of Townships by me Appointed, He taking out a Patent for
the same within three months after thou shalt make Returns thereof into my
Secretaries Office, w^{ch} thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient Speed.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Pensbury, ye 2^d day of ye 7th moth 1700.
