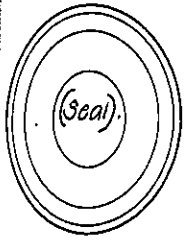


Pensilvania:



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in
Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Christopher Pennock That I would grant him a Resurvey on
a Tract of Land formerly Survey'd unto him by Virtue of my Warrant, lying on the River
Schuylkill between the Lands of John Holland and William Sharlow and reputed
to be a Thousand Acres: These are to require thee forth with to resurvey or cause
to be resurvey'd the said Tract according to the old Bounds and outlines thereof
as also according to the Lines of Subdivision within the said Tract, dividing the
Lands of Morgan David, Cadwallader Lewis and Matthew Clements purchasers
of the said Land under the said Christoph^r Pennock, and make Returns there-
of into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal the 16th day of the
6th Month 1700.
