At the Request of Thomas Parsons Purchaser of one Thousand Acres that

I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in this Province. These are
to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him according to the
Method of Townships by me appointed the sd Number of five hundred Acres of Land
in the County of Chester where it has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is
concealed nor Seated by the Indians to be by him seated within twelve Months
after Survey, And make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under
my hand and Seal at Pensbury the 26th of the 3^d moth 1701.
