



Edward Pleadwell's Land in Chester County in Pennsylvania, Survey'd as part of Seven Hundred acres Granted to him by Warrt from ye Proprietor's Comm. Dated ye 10th of July 1717.

Beginning at a corner Marked White Oak standing on the South side of Octoraro Creek thence East, North East by Vacant Land Eighty perches to a Pine Tree Thence North North west by vacant Land two hundred & fifty eight perches to a Chesnut tree, Thence west, south, west forty eight perches to a black oak by ye sd Octoraro Creek thence up the same south 30 degrees Easterly 16 perches, south 23 Degrees westerly 125 perches, south 40 Degrees westerly 30 perches, south 26 Degrees Easterly 26 perches south 35 Degrees Easterly 54 perches south East 32 perches, south Seventy five Degrees Easterly 52 perches thence East 22 perches to ye place of beginning Containing Two Hundred acres.

Survey'd ye 16th of July 1717.
