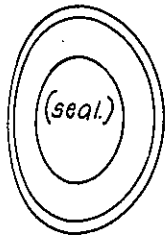


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Edw^d Pleadwell of Philad^{ia}. That we would Grant him to take up Seven hundred Acres of Land in the County of Chester for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use seventy pounds and the yearly Rent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred for ever One fourth part of the s^d seventy pounds viz Seventeen pounds ten shillings within three months after the date hereof and the Remainder in twelve months after: These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be resurvey'd to the said Edw^d Pleadwell according to the Method of Townships in the said County of Chester the said quantity of vacant Land that has not been appropriated nor Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office in order to a further confirmation, with which Agreement if the said Edw^d duly comply, the said Survey is to be valid, otherwise the same is to be void and of no Effect as if it had never been made nor this warr^t ever Granted, Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 10th day of the 5th Month A.D. 1717.
