At the Request of Israel Pemberton that we would Grant him to take up four Hundred and eighty acres of Land the remainder of James Delworths purchase of one Thousand acres the right to which being now vested in the said Israel, These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Israel Pemberton according to the method of Townships the said quantity of four hundred and eighty Acres of Land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 19th of y^e 11^{mo} Anno Dni, 1719.
