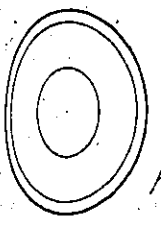


Pennsylvania:



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Anthony Pretter of East Jersey that we would Grant

him to take up three hundred Acres of Land near Pecquean or to the South-

ward of Cocestagoe Creek for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use thirty Pounds

within three Months after Survey and y^e yearly Quitrent of one English Shil-

ling for each hundred for ever: These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or Cause

to be survey'd to the said Anthony Pretter according to the Method of Townships the

said quantity of three hundred Acres of Land in y^e place afores'd where not already

survey'd, appropriated nor Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof

into the secretaries Office which Survey in case the same be made within twelve

Months after the date hereof and the said Anthony duly pay the said consideration

Money according to y^e afores'd Agreement shall be valid otherwise to be void & of

no effect as if it had never been made nor this Warr't ever Granted Given under

our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 16th day of Novemb^r 1716.
