Pennsylvania ss:

At the Request of Archibald McDonald of the County of Chester that we would
 Land
 Grant him to take up five Hundred acres of ~~land~~ in the said County for
 which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifty Pounds for the whole and the Usual Year-
 ly Quitrent of one shilling ^{sterling} for every Hundred Acres these are to Authorize and Require
 thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Archibald McDonald in the place
 aforesaid and according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of
 five Hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is
 Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey
 in case the said Archibald fulfill the above agreement within three months after Lo-
 cation shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made
 nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our Hands and Seale of the Province at
~~Province~~ at Philadelphia the 22^d day of the Tenth Month Anno Dⁿⁱ 1714.
