Then surveyed for Calib. Pusey 100 acres of Land, 90 acres of the s<sup>d</sup> Land being expresed by one warrent and 10 acres by another warrent lying on the east side of Chester creek begining at a marked post near the creekside and running N.N.E. into ye woods 160 pertch to a marked hickry from thence W.N.W. 110 pertch to a marked white oak from thence S.S.W. 125 pertch to a marked post being the corner post of the mill Land from thence E.S.E. 48 pertch along the mill line to another marked post being a marked corner post of the mill land from thence S.S.W. 40 pertch along the mill line to a (obl.) post from thence S. 72 degrees E. to a marked post 6 pertch, from thence S.S.W. 3 pertch to a marked post from thence N. 72 degrees W. 6 pertch to a marked post from thence S. 50 degrees W. to a marked post standing by the creekside and from thence down the Creek on several courses to the first menched marked post.
