Whereas by our Warrt dated 24th 9^{mo} last We Granted unto Isaac Few Six hundred acres of Land which has since been duly laid out to him and returned by thee Scituate on Brandywine Creek Adjoyning on the land of George Harland and the sd Isaac has since convey'd the sd Land to Robert Pennel and Benjamin Mendenhal both of the County of Chester and where-

as it is represented to us That there is a small parcel of vacant Land Scituate between ye sd Tract of Six hundred Acres and the sd Land of Geo. Harland reputed to contain about fifty Acres w^{ch} the sd Robt and Benjamin request of us to Grant on ye same terms on which ye sd Tract was by us granted: These therefore are according to their sd Request to Authorize & Require thee to Survey and lay out to the sd Robert Pennel and Benja. Mendenhal the sd tract of vacant Land Scituate as aforesd provided ye whole Vacancy there comprehend not ye quantity of one hundred Acres. And make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary which Survey in case the sd Robert and Benjamin shall pay for the sd Land as aforesd within ten dayes after Survey or six weeks after ye date hereof at farthest shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no Effect.
