At the Request of Samuel Miles of this Province who came to the Same
a. Servant to the Society in the Year 1682. That in consideration of his Servitude,
We would in pursuance of the Proprietors Concessions in the like cases, Grant
him to take up his Right of head-Land being fifty Acres under the Usual Quitt-
rent of an half penny ^{per} Acre Sterling Money, these are to Authorize and Require
thee to survey and lay out to the Said Samuel Miles the Said quantity of fifty A-
cres of Land where not taken up nor conceal'd nor seated by the Indians, to
be held on the terms aforesaid, and make Return into the General Surveyors
Office at Philadelphia, where the Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be
delivered to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and
seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 3^d day of 7ber. 1705.
