By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jno. Musgrove of the County of Chester That we would Grant him to take up six hundred Acres of Land upon Octaroe River or in the parts adjacent for which he has agreed to pay to the Proprietors Use Sixty pounds of lawful Money within three Months from ye date hereof. These are to authorize & Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd to the said Jno Musgrove according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Six hundred Acres of Land on or near the sd River that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by ye Indians, and make Returns into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case the sd John comply with the Agreement aforesd be Valid otherwise the same shall be wholly void as if this warrant had not been granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the Eighth Month A.D. 1713.
