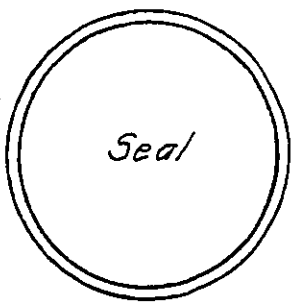

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup> in chief  
of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties annexed

At the Request of Joseph Jervais That I would grant him to take up a Tract  
of vacant Land in Middletown in the County of Chester reputed to contain  
about one hundred and fifty Acres Seated first by Rob<sup>t</sup> Woodworth on presumption  
and now by the s<sup>d</sup> Jervais These are to require theeforthwith to Survey or cause  
to be survey'd to y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Joseph Jervais the s<sup>d</sup> Tract of Vacant Land according  
to y<sup>e</sup> Bounds of the Survey'd Land adjoining round it He complying with  
such Terms <sup>th</sup>in one Month after the date of Survey as shall be agreed on  
by two such psons as I shall appoint to conclude the same, and make  
Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and  
Seal at Philad<sup>ia</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> of 7<sup>ber</sup> 1701.
