At the Request of Isaac Joffeure That We would Grant him to take up three hundred Acres of Land or more adjoining to the Settlement^s made by the Palatins towards Comestogoe for which he hath Agreed to ~~pay~~ pay immediately after Survey ten pounds for each hundred acres & so proportionably and One shilling sterling p hundred for a Yearly Quitte^t. These are to Authorize thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the s^d Isaac Joffeure according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of three hundred Acres or more if he shall desire it in y^e said place where vacant and not yet survey'd nor taken up nor seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which said Survey in case the s^d Isaac comply with the said agreement in paying of the s^d Consideration Money shall be valid, otherwise shall be void as if the same had never been made nor this Warr^t ever Granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 15th day of the 4th Month A D 1713
