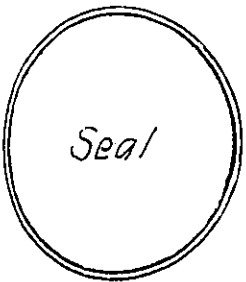

At the Request of Peter Lemann now of the Township of Strasburg in this Province that We would Grant him to take up in or near the said Township the quantity of three hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Thirty Pounds Money of the said Province for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Peter Lemann in or near the Place aforesaid According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriate nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said Peter fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof Shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at

Philadelphia the 27th day of September Ann Dni 1717
