At the Request of Samuel Lewis of Darby in this Province that We would Grant him to take up near the Branches of Brandywine Creek the quantity of five hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifty Pounds Money of the s<sup>d</sup> Province for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Samuel Lewis on or near the Place aforesaid According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land that hath not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said Samuel fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made or this Warrant ever granted Given under ~~our~~ our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> day of 9<sup>th</sup> Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1717
