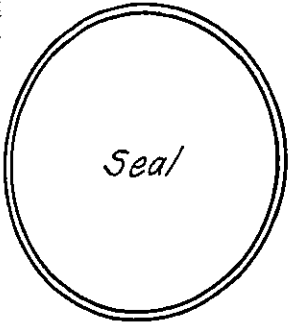

At the Request of Jacob Lundus and Ulrick Hawry both of the Township of Strasburg in this Province that We would Grant them to take up in or near the said Township the quantity of one hundred and fifty Acres of Land for which they agree to pay the Proprietors use ffifteen pounds Money of the sd. Province for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling and Six pence Sterling These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Jacob Lundus and Ulrick Hawry in or near the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred and fifty Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Jacob and Ulrick fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 27th day of September Anno Domini 1717
