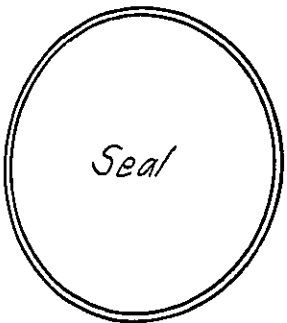

By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of *Hans Lime* late of Germany but now of this Province that We would Grant him to take up at or near *Conestogo* the quantity of *Nine hundred Acres* of Land for which He agrees to pay to the use of y^e Trustees *Ninety Pounds Money* of Pennsylvania for y^e whole and y^e Yearly quitrent of *One Shilling Sterling* for every hundred Acres thereof These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said *Hans Lime* at the Place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of *Nine hundred Acres* of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said *Hans Lime* fulfill the above agreement within three Months after y^e date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and the Seal of y^e Province at Philadelphia the 4th day of October Anno Domini 1718
