survey'd for the use and service of the people called Quakers
of the meeting and Town of Philadelphia all those two tracts of
ground situate on the south side of Mulberry street fenced and
paled in and now by them used for publick burying places, ac-
cording to the present lines of Inclosure and make returns
thereof into my secretaries office. Given under (obi) hand and
seal at Phila^{del}phia the 28th day of the twelfth month in y^e
year 170⁹
