

Pennsylvania ss. By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of John Leech & Isaac Leech that We would Grant them to take up the Quantity of Three Hundred Seventy five Acres of Land in this Province purchased of the late Proprietor by Geoffrey Alcock of Ordsleyford in the County of Chester in Great Britain by one Deed Indented bearing date the 16th day of the fifth Month anno 1691 who by a like Deed dated the 6th day of Feb anno 1723 Did Grant & Assigne the same Land unto Peter Dicks of the County of Chester in this Province who by Deeds of Lease and Release dated the 21st & 22^d dayes of this Instant Granted & Released the said Land unto the said John Leech & Isaac Leech their Heirs & Assignes forever These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in Right of the purchase made of the Prop^r as aforesaid, Toward Sasquahanna River according to the Terms of the first mentioned Deed and to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three Hundred Seventy ^{five} Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the Third Month Anno Dom 1725
