


By vertue of two warrants to me directed by Cap<sup>t</sup> Thomas Holme survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>. The one bareing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1684. to lay out unto Thos. Rudyard his proportion of Land in any County within the Province of Pensilvania and also one other warrant bareing date the 27<sup>th</sup> of the first mo<sup>th</sup> 1693 to lay out unto Andrew Robison the remainder of his purchase from Tho<sup>s</sup> Rudyard. These may certifiye that I have accordingly surveyed and layed out unto the said Andrew Robeson the quantity of two thousand five hundred acres of land part of the said purchas- within the County of Philadelphia, Beginning at a post, of Derick Sipmans land thence north west eight hundred thirty foure perches to a white oke marked for a corner thence south west by the land of Jacob Tellener and Comp<sup>s</sup> foure hundred and eighty perches to a black oke saplin- Thence south east by the propri (obl.) eight hundred thirty foure perches to a black oke marked for (obliterated) Thence north east by the Township of Tho. Harley and other land (obl.) hundred and eighty perches to the first mentioned post standing nere a small hickry tree.
