By vertue of a warrant from ye Proprietary & Govern^r bearing date the 21st of ye 12th Moneth last [directed to me] I hereby Certify into his Secretarys Office, yt I have caused to be Surveyed & set out unto William Harwood. R. a Lott in ye City of Philadelphia the 28th of ye said Moneth, Scituated between ye third & fourth streets from ~~the~~ ~~the~~ Skoolkill, Containing in breadth forty nine foot and a half, and in length three hundred and six foot obl Northward wth back Lotts Eastward wth James Claytons ^{Jun^r his} Lott southward wth Mulberry street formerly called Holme street, Westerly wth a vacant Lott. and is accordingly Entered & Recorded in my Office. Philadelphia this 6th 4th M^o 1684.
