in *the* afores<sup>d</sup> County, where not already taken up, according to *the* Method of  
Townships appointed by *the* Govern<sup>r</sup> he seating & improving the same w<sup>th</sup>in  
Six Months from *the* date of survey and make returns thereof into *the* Govern<sup>r</sup>'s
